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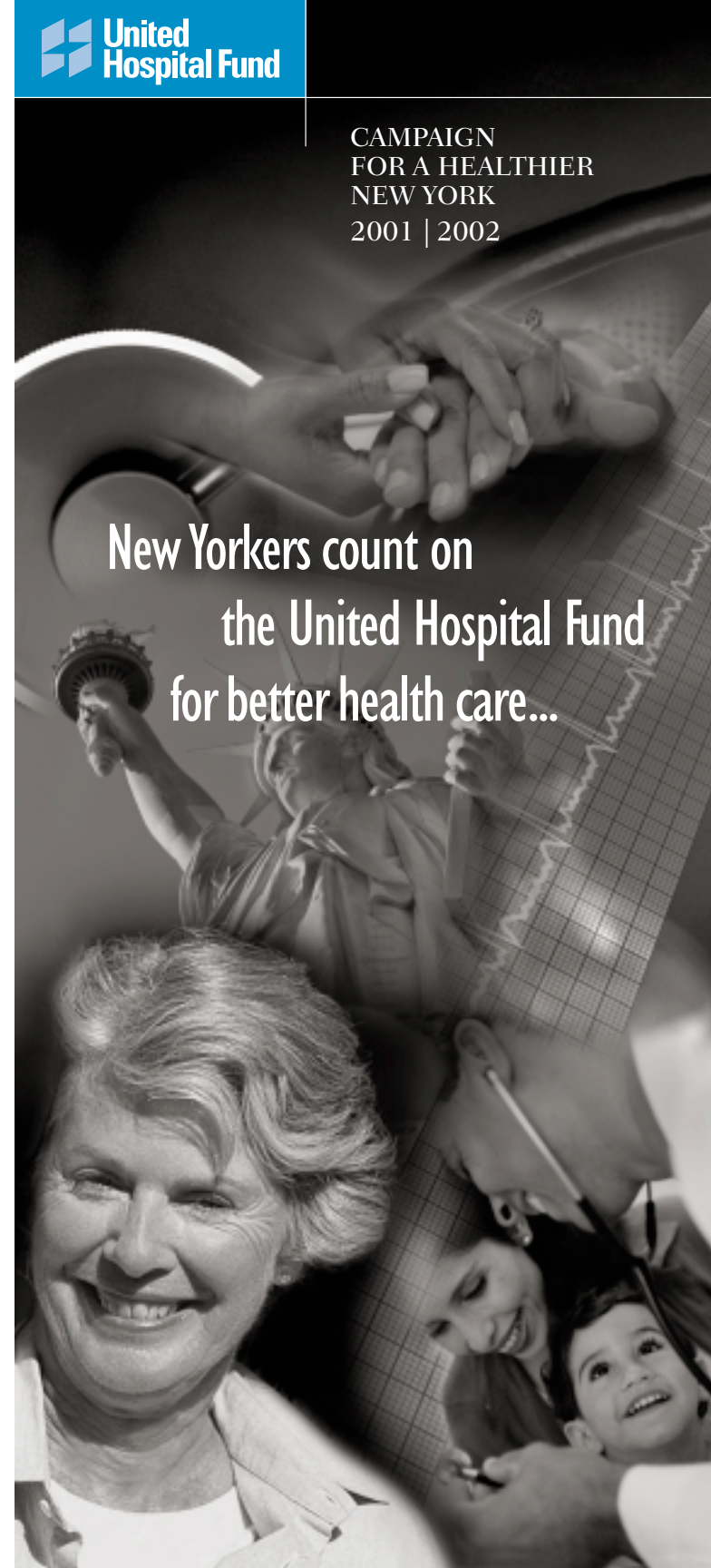

Our researchers explore issues ranging from the problem of the uninsured to improving patient care in hospitals, health centers, and nursing homes. Through millions of dollars in grants, the Fund stimulates fresh thinking and launches groundbreaking initiatives—from advancing innovations in home care to helping hospitals and community physicians provide more sensitive care to patients at the end of life.

We bring together policymakers and health care experts to find better ways to deliver, organize, and finance health care. And we sustain a tradition of activism by promoting and supporting health care voluntarism.

## How is the United Hospital Fund improving health care in New York?

**ISSUE:** 1.8 MILLION NEW YORKERS HAVE NO HEALTH INSURANCE.

**IMPACT:** The Fund has examined the causes of this problem that affects one in four New Yorkers under age 65, and is advancing real solutions. We're helping working adults gain access to coverage, as well as all of the city's children. We're helping small businesses offer insurance to their employees. And we're promoting efforts to cover immigrants—the group hardest hit by lack of insurance.



**ISSUE:** LOW-INCOME NEW YORKERS CAN'T ALWAYS GET THE CARE THEY NEED.

**IMPACT:** Through research and major grants, the Fund is working to ensure that vulnerable New Yorkers can continue to rely on the hospitals and health centers that they have traditionally turned to for care. We're also working with communities and health care providers to redesign care to better meet the needs of patients and their families.



**ISSUE:** ALL NEW YORKERS ARE CONCERNED ABOUT HEALTH CARE QUALITY.

**IMPACT:** Through targeted grants, we're improving the quality of care for patients throughout the city. We're helping to provide more sensitive, appropriate care to those who are seriously ill or at the end of life, whether they are in hospitals, nursing homes, hospices, or being cared for at home. We're also supporting innovative efforts to improve the quality of life for nursing home residents.



**ISSUE:** FRAIL, ILL, AND DISABLED NEW YORKERS REQUIRE MORE CARE AND SUPPORT THAN EVER.

**IMPACT:** We're helping seniors remain independent and engaged in their own communities by supporting programs that bring an innovative mix of health care and social services to them in their own homes. We're helping stimulate responses to better train and support family caregivers. And we're improving and strengthening home care services for people with chronic illnesses.
